PLATE III.—THE ARMS OF THE MOST HONOURABLE SIR JOHN PATRICK CRICHTON STUART, Marquess of Bute; Earl of Windsor; Viscount Mountjoy of the Isle of Wight; Baron Mountstuart of Wortley, co. York; Baron Cardiff of Cardiff, all in the Peerage of Great Britain; Carl of Dumfries; Viscount Air and Lord Crichton of Sanquhar and Cumnock; Carl of Bute; Viscount Kingarth; Lord Mountstuart, Cumra, and Inchmarnock, all in the Peerage of Scotland; a Baronet of Nova Scotia; Knight of the Thistle; Dereditary Sheriff of the County of Bute; and Dereditary Respect of Rothesay Castle.

BLAZON-

Quarterly, 1st and 4th or, a fess checqué, azure and argent, within a double tressure flory-counterflory gules—for Stuart.


2d and 3d argent, a lion rampant, azure—for Crichton.

On a canton, in dexter chief, the Arms of Poba Scotia—for the Baronetcy. Crest—A demi-lion rampant, gules, with the motto "Pobilis est ira leonis."

Supporters—Bexter, a horse, argent, bridled gules: Sinister—A stag proper, attired or.

Motto—"Abito biret honore."

Round the shield is disposed the collar and pendant of the Order of the Thistle; and at the corners of the compartment are shown oak branches, being the badge of this branch of the Stuart Family.
