Two Convenorships are at present unfilled but the previous convenors have remained as committee members. Mr James Brown was elected to the Committee and was then elected as Chairperson and the previous incumbent Mr Rob Close took over as Secretary from Denis Rattenbury who stepped down but continued on the Committee. Mr Chris Hawksworth was co-opted to the committee during the year. Members of the Management Committee are elected at the Annual General Meeting each year and a member can serve for a maximum period of three years before standing for re-election.

The Management Committee elect from their members persons to act as Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. Their tenure of office is the same as for the other members of the Management Committee. These three positions then become the Trustees for the Society.

The Annual General Meeting was held on 21 March 2024 at an in-person meeting. At the meeting the previous committee was re-elected on bloc except for the Vice-chairman, Angus Rodger, who has stepped down.

5. Management

The Management Committee, who hold regular meetings, are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the Society. They generally control the activities of the Society and have a general responsibility to safeguard the assets of the Society.

6. Activities

In order to achieve the Society's aims, relevant lectures are held over the winter season, relevant excursions are held over the summer season and monographs are produced on relevant subjects. The lectures and excursions are open to members of the public.

The monographs, on topics relevant to Ayrshire, are published at a minimum rate of one per year and are free to members.

"Ayrshire Notes" are published twice yearly in conjunction with Ayrshire Federation of Historical Societies and are free as downloads from our website. A small number are published in paper form for those members who do not use the internet.

7. Achievements and Performance

The Society continued to meet this year through either the on-line services of Zoom, a practice started during the pandemic, or by in-person meetings. Membership numbers have improved but our "in-person" meetings have still to achieve their pre-pandemic numbers. A good number of our members would prefer the meetings to be via Zoom which is why we are now looking at hybrid meetings to allow for both options. We do realize that this will need better technical input. That will allow us to provide lectures to our overseas members and also allow us to get speakers from overseas using zoom. As an extension of the reciprocal publication arrangement that we have with the Dumfries & Galloway Natural History and Antiquarian Society, we have continued the reciprocal arrangement regarding our talks on Zoom. This has been most successful. A Zoom meeting can easily have between 50 and 70 attendees which is comparable with our previous in-person meetings.

We are receiving a positive response regarding the subject matters of the lectures and the standard of our publications. We have returned to having Summer Excursions but to local locations and these were well attended.

We are now advertising through the Scottish Local History Forum and through Nielsen, our ISBN contact. Our monograph publication sales have greatly increased following the publications on Ayr and also Arran.

We have continued to scan a number of our older out-of-print monographs and collections and have up-loaded them to our new website. Likewise, we have up-loaded all of our Ayrshire Notes. Also uploaded, are publications from the previous organisation – the Ayrshire and Galloway Archaeological Association. This will make them more readily available to the general public. There has been an increase in website visits and this has resulted in more sales of our available publications.

We now have a Facebook presence which holds up-to-date information for our members and other interested parties.

8. Financial Review

The main sources of our funding are from memberships and from sales of publications.

The Receipts exceeded the Payments in the year by £1,001, increasing our total liquid funds balance to £17,801. We have also continued to publish two monographs during this year. The treasurer placed some of our balance into a term deposit account which gave us bank interest of £330.

We have a commitment to reducing our expenditure wherever possible. As such we are moving to more use of emails and to Facebook. We have had to post out most of our publications this year resulting in an increase in postage costs. However, we still managed to save £331 in postage costs by hand delivering publications where possible. We at present operate a current account with Virgin Money and there is now also a Term Deposit Account.

9. Reserves Policy

The Management Committee's policy is to maintain reserves at a level which will allow the Society to take advantage of any publishing opportunities which may arise from time to time. Accordingly, the Trustees expect to maintain reserves at a minimum equivalent of 12 months expenditure. The current reserves meet this criterion.

10. Plans for Future Periods

The Management Committee is keen to publish monographs relevant to Ayrshire but occasionally there is the potential to publish a series of related monographs into a larger publication. We are awaiting potential publication of an archaeological investigation. Previously we published a similar article in an A4 layout and we would like to do the same here. This would be in place of our normal A5 publications. We also have a number of potential monographs which are progressing towards publication stage.

The Society is continuing to update its new website and are committed to keeping the Facebook page up to date and interesting. The numbers accessing our sites have increased and we have gained new members through these media. We have also increased our local advertising.

We have found that recently academics are now approaching us to publish their articles though our system which means that we are being seen as the publishers of up-to-date and reliable articles. By using Zoom we have increased the potential for new speakers from further afield. It is the intention to continue to make use of this additional facility.

The Committee also intend to attempt to reach a wider field of interest for our publications.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Ayrshire Archaeological and Natural History Society

I report on the financial statements of the Society for the year ending 31st January 2024, which are set out on pages 6 to 8.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The Society's Management Committee are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations"). The charity's Management Committee consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10 (1)(d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44 (1)(c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the Independent Examiner's Statement
